

## **MA in Counseling Degree Plan**

The Master's degree in Counseling requires 63 credit hours. This program takes 3-3.5 years or more to complete. Courses are designed to provide gradual and stratified skill-building experiences, beginning with introductory courses and culminating with internship. With this in mind, course sequencing maximizes the learning and skill-building process. Students are responsible for reviewing the catalog and schedule to be certain that all prerequisites for courses have been taken. ALL COURSEWORK, with a noted exception in the <a href="School Counseling">School Counseling</a> track, MUST BE TAKEN BEFORE the student may register to PRACTICUM.
