The MA in Culturally & Linguistically Diverse Education (CLDE) requires 4 core courses (12 credits). In consultation and with approval from your faculty advisor, select 4 elective courses to customize your learning (12 credits). Finally, take CLDE 6912 as your research course (3 credits) and then complete the Capstone course (3 credits) for a total of 30 credits.

Unique Circumstances:

BAMA, ASPIRE, and PEBC: All three of these CU Denver programs allow you to apply 9 graduate credits that can be used toward the MA.
